STEP BY STEP: How to build a centuries-old dwelling

Step 1: Making a drawing of the fortress in a square grid

Estimated time: 30 min


With ruler and pencil, measure the object in the picture as individual parts. Draws the individual towers of the fort.



Step 2: Presentation of completed drawings

Estimated time: 15 min

Students present the finished drawings, in two versions - small and large squares. It is good to have them made with coloured pencil, to make them stand out.







Step 3: Making a medieval dwelling

Estimated time: 30 min

Make a dwelling out of stamped materials and clay, following the steps of consruction:

- Prepare the base outline the shape of the dwelling with a ruler and pencil to make a rectangle.
- Place clay/ plasticine for base.
- Place a vertical stick in each of the four corners to serve as a column.







- Build the walls on the base by alternating a row of clay and a row of pebbles.
- Leave holes in the walls for doors and windows.



- When clay is used, smooth the walls on the inside and outside with water to prevent cracking.
- Place horizontal roofing sticks on the walls and cover with leaves or grass.

Step 4: Comparison of types of dwellings

Estimated time: 5 min

Compare the housing they have made with the building of the fortress "Baba Vida" and modern houses.
