



Brussels Grand Place

General information			
Respective blueprint	Flower carpet		
Description	Students will get to know the European capital, Brussels, and the Grand Place's colourful carpet in front of the Town Hall. They will also learn about the other member countries of the European Union. They will create a common product - a colourful napkin carpet and their product - a country flag. They will solve compound number expressions with different mathematical operations, find an unknown number in an equation, the circumference of a rectangle and work with units of measurement.		
Learning objectives	 To acquire knowledge about the continent of Europe, the European capital, the square with the flower carpet, the flags of the member countries of the European Union and the anthem; To practise mathematical operations - addition, subtraction, multiplication and division; To update the knowledge of a rectangle and its elements; To learn practical skills and develop qualities such as diligence, accuracy, precision, aesthetic taste and the ability to work in a team. 		
Related curricular subjects	History - knowledge about the continent of Europe, the European capital, the flags of the member states, the anthem; Geography - location of the continent and Brussels on the map; Mathematics - solving arithmetic problems, knowledge of rectangles; Technology and enterprise - making a model of carpet and flags; Music - perform the anthem of Europe.

Inclusivity guidelines			





How to integrate students with SLD	 Formulate short, simple instructions that only require one action at a time. If you give oral instructions, keep track of them in the form of pictograms or written on the board. When you give instructions (oral or written), highlight the word of action so pupils know what they are expected to do. When possible, you can show the expected result of the manipulation. When creating groups, try to place students with difficulties with students who are generally more advanced so that they can help each other (for example, a dyspraxic student will have much difficulty with cutting tasks).
How to integrate students who work faster	Quicker students will monitor whether the requirements for glueing and drawing flowers on the carpet are met. When making the flags, they will help the students who are delayed.





Step-by-step description of the lesson

Step 1: Math problems

Estimated time: 5 minutes

The class is divided into 4 teams.

On a worksheet, they solve problems and find a code word /Europe/.

Step 2: History and facts

Estimated time:

15 minutes

Introduction:

- Europe one of the seven continents, composed of many countries.
 27 are united in a political and economic union, including Bulgaria.
 The European Union contributes to advancing peace and consensus, democracy and human rights in Europe. Our country became a member of the European Union on 1 January 2007. The seat of the European Parliament is in three countries Belgium, France and Luxembourg.
- Belgium is a small Western European country with a rich cultural heritage and interesting history. It boasts incredibly delicious cuisine, beer and chocolate that are a must-try.
- One of the major attractions in the capital, Brussels is the Grand Place. It is home to the town hall and other buildings with impressive architecture. Many tourists visit it. What attracts them is the colourful carpet made of over 700,000 living begonias.
- Not far from it, in front of the European Parliament building, the flags of the Member States are raised on high pylons.

Step 3: EU countries

Estimated time:

5 minutes

They solve a word problem and get the number of EU member states in the answer.

The map of Europe is displayed on the interactive board, and the students name the countries that are members of the European Union.

Step 4: EU countries' flags

Estimated time:

15 minutes

Every country has its symbols, and one of them is the flag.





Each student from the four teams has the task of drawing the flag of an EU country. They find the image on the internet /tablet, phone/ and recreate it on the block sheet.

They place a wooden stick as a handle.

Flags are arranged in rows.

Step 5: Creating a flower carpet

Estimated time:

40 minutes

Students make a model of the Great Square carpet on a cadastron by glueing balls of coloured napkins, following the motifs in the photo.

They join the individual elements made by each team to form a large carpet.

They comment on its shape. Name the elements of the geometric figure and look for objects around them with the same condition.

They find the circumference of the model of the carpet.

Assessment activities


Activity 1: Game












Flower carpet
